Air Pollution: the silent threat

Air pollution is a major environmental risk to health. By reducing air pollution levels, countries can reduce the burden of disease from stroke, heart disease, lung cancer, and both chronic and acute respiratory diseases, including asthma. Four local authorities in the region – Bradford, Calderdale, Hull, and Wakefield - are working together to test ways of improving air quality. The work is being led by public health but will involve colleagues from across the authorities.

Mapping of Public Access Defibrillators

The Improvement Academy and Yorkshire Ambulance Service are working in partnership with the British Heart Foundation and have been awarded funding to look at the location and intelligent mapping of Public Access Defibrillators in Yorkshire and the Humber.

This Project aims to determine the location and details of all Public Access Defibrillators (PADs) in Yorkshire & Humber and to provide intelligent data on where defibrillators should be placed in the community. The overall goal will be to increase the use of PADs in out of hospital cardiac arrests and increase survival rates.
