Managing Patient Flow at Scarborough Hospital

The recent unprecedented pressures on A&E Departments have been reported in the national media this month. Scarborough Hospital was featured on Radio 4's Today programme as an example of a hospital that has experienced particularly high levels of demand. We're working with Scarborough Hospital to implement and evaluate a patient flow methodology known as Visual Hospital. Whilst in itself this doesn't prevent the pressures; Scarborough have told us that, unlike previous years, they have been able to review, every single patient, every 2 hours and target resources appropriately to effect an increased number of discharges.



Masterclass on Value in Healthcare - 4 March 2015, Leeds

In the NHS difficult decisions need to be made regarding the allocation of scarce resources. In this half-day Masterclass Professor Gwyn Bevan and Greg Fell will explore a number of contemporary methods that can be readily applied to any system to improve value within existing spending and service patterns, including the STAR (Socio Technical Allocation of Resources) tool and Programme Budgeting and Marginal Analysis.
