### Sepsis for Achieving Behaviour Change

On 2<sup>nd</sup> June 48 frontline clinical staff from 6 Yorkshire Trusts came together for an



'Achieving Behavioural Change' workshop facilitated by Dr Judith Dyson.

The event focused on understanding the barriers to good sepsis care. Discussions were wide ranging and barriers were identified in understanding the importance and meaning of observations, and accurate recording and escalation when patients screen positive.

Fabulous informative day. Very enjoyable and entertaining as well as inspiring.

Really helpful in determining barriers/ challenges to implementing change. Ensures a logical approach to determine the root cause to the problem/behaviour.

This event is just the first stage, and more focused work is planned with Calderdale & Huddersfield and Bradford Trusts on the specific behaviours identified as key issues. This work will be shared through our informal regional Acute Trust Sepsis Network. For more information contact Mel Johnson.

#### UKIA Safety Huddles Visit—June 2017

The first UKIA members visit hosted by the Improvement Academy took place earlier this month in Leeds when we welcomed

visitors from London, Cumbria, Northern Ireland, Glasgow and Sheffield. There was a great deal of interest in our work on **Huddles** which participants observed first hand by visiting huddling wards in our region.

The visit included presentations from Yvette Oade, Chief Medical Officer at Leeds Teaching Hospitals covering work on an organisational level and Carmel Lister from Harrogate District Hospital on the role of a Huddles coach.

Claire Mevin, Associate Improvement Advisor at Healthcare Improvement Scotland, gave us some great feedback: "Very informative visit. Great to view two completely different huddles both with the same focus of identifying patients at risk in order to prevent harm".
