Scaling up HUSH project - things we've done and learnt

The HUSH (Huddle Up for Safer Healthcare) Health Foundation funded project to scale up huddles across more than 120 hospital wards will be completed in July 2017, but work is continuing with Safety Huddles becoming a Patient





Safety flagship programme. We have accumulated a wealth of knowledge which we are happy to share, and can offer advice from what we have learnt along the way. A

lot of this learning has come from seeing how Safety Huddles work in different settings such as acute, mental health, care homes & community, as well as non-clinical (porter huddles in Leeds), and how this has been adapted to the existing working environment without impacting heavily on resources. As part of our future work, we are expanding our existing coaches network and working in collaboration with the Measurement and Monitoring of Safety Framework. We will be creating a Coaching Manual along the

Updated Huddles Manual



As a result of Safety Huddles spreading beyond the Yorkshire and Humber region, we have now updated our current Huddles Manual. This is a short comprehensive guide for teams who are thinking about implementing Huddles in their workplace and outlines the basic principles of a Safety Huddle, how to get started and our pilot Huddles Accreditation scheme.

Implementing more reliable person-centred care in Mexborough and Barnsley

The Yorkshire & Humber Patient Safety Collaborative has been focussing on improving "person centred care" using the ABC toolkit. At first glance person centred care may not appear to be directly linked to Patient Safety but we know that often health care does 'to' or 'for' people rather than 'with'. If we foster or maintain dependency, we allow patients to fail to recognise their own strengths and abilities, thus increasing risk of harm, delaying functional improvements and lengthening stay. We have been working with teams at Bassetlaw Hospital on reliably implementing 'This is me' on admission (over 120 to date) and Mexborough hospital to improve the delivery of 'enabling care' on a rehabilitation ward. Staff have been open and honest in sharing some of the barriers and we are working together on actions to make an improvement. For more information on this, contact Mel Johnson.
