- To equip you with the skills and knowledge required to participate in QI work now and in the future.
- To begin to put into practice some of the skills you will need to lead a QIP

## Course Overview:

- You will work through the Institute for Healthcare Improvement's Model for Improvement.
- You will work together and apply what you are learning to an example ED problem.
- There will be time for reflection and planning for your own projects.

## Course Requirements:

Delegates must have:

- At least six-month timescale to run a QIP
- An initial idea for a QIP (agreed with your supervisor)
- opportunity/plan to hand over a project (where required)

- 1 hour pre-arranged mentorship from a member of the Improvement Academy QI Support team with opportunity to purchase more if required
